As we commemorate our twenty years of service to Portland's neediest citizens, we want to take a moment to acknowledge the accomplishments of our many volunteers and supporters. Although our meal count has increased over 25% since 2008, we've never run out of food or had to turn anyone away.

For much of our history, Potluck has been one of Portland's best kept secrets, except among the guests we serve. In the last five years, our great word-of-mouth has reached a broader community attracting new donors, corporate sponsors and business partners. Because of partnerships with food and supply donors like Oregon Food Bank and Birch Community Services, Potluck has successfully met the escalating demand for our services.

But Potluck still needs your financial support. Your donations help us buy food to supplement the donated food, help us buy the 1000 plates, forks and napkins we use weekly, help us rent the kitchen space where we store over 3000 pounds of food and supplies gleaned each week.
